Early Childhood Assessment Teams (ECAT)



Your child will be evaluated by a team that may include an audiologist, vision specialist, school psychologist, speech/language pathologist, occupational therapist, physical therapist and social worker.

This is the waiting room where you and your child will be greeted by a member of the ECAT team.



Your child can play in this room while waiting for the assessment to begin.



The evaluation begins with your child's vision screening.



This is one of the vision tasks that
your child may be asked to do.



The next step is having your child's hearing tested.



For the hearing testing, your child may wear headphones.



Following the vision and hearing evaluation, an ECAT team will evaluate your child's development through play.



Here is a look at one of the play rooms.



These toys are used to assess problem solving skills, use and understanding of language and fine motor skills.



Your child's gross motor skills will also be evaluated.



While your child is being evaluated, you may be interviewed by a social worker to discuss your concerns regarding your child.



After testing, the team will give you a summary of their observations regarding your child's development. A meeting will then be set up with your school district to discuss the evaluation results and possible school services.
